

### **Extenders Likely to Slip to 2018**

The tax extenders bill that was introduced in the Senate last week is now looking likely to slip to 2018. It was not attached to the spending bill to keep the government open and while both the House and Senate are meeting this week, the Senate is meeting in pro forma and the House is meeting late in the day for a short meeting. It is unlikely that votes will be scheduled during this time. With respect to certain fuel tax related provisions, if the extenders slip to next year, the following will result:

1. The \$0.09 per barrel oil spill tax will expire on December 31, 2017.
2. The biodiesel, renewable diesel and alternative fuel tax credits will remain expired.
